Every spring semester, the Council of Pre-health Organizations hosts the “Catch the Wave to Success Pre-health Conference.” Our goal is to educate and better prepare pre-health students for their future health careers. The conference brings together over 300 pre-health SDSU students and collegiate students from all over Southern California for our main conference, as well as San Diego area high school students for our graduate school and volunteer fair. The conference covers a variety of different topics that are vital in helping students become socially responsible health professionals. Our multi-disciplinary conference offers information and hands-on opportunities for students interested in Medicine (MD, DO, ND), Dentistry, Pharmacy, Optometry, Veterinary, Chiropractic, Physician Assistant, Physical Therapy, and Occupational Therapy careers as well as information for post-bacc programs and Masters of Nursing options for those students without a prior BSN degree. The conference consists of workshops, speakers, student and admissions panels, and a graduate school and volunteer fair for the students to explore their interests and become stronger applicants.

Our student-run committee has 3 governing positions, 13 directors for various tasks, and spots for members at large. Students plan the entire conference with guidance of pre-health advisor Gwen Hill. The benefits of this conference are offering students insight into health career fields, fueling their passions, and giving SDSU national recognition as a pre-health preparation university option.
